College of Notre Dame of Maryland, located on Baltimore's historic college corridor and just fifteen minutes from the downtown Inner Harbor area, invites nominations and applications for the position of Vice President for Student Development. The first Catholic college for women to grant the four-year baccalaureate degree, College of Notre Dame of Maryland educates approximately 500 women in the traditional undergraduate program and 2,500 in the co-ed Accelerated/Weekend College and Graduate Studies Program.

The VPSD reports to the President and provides leadership for co-curricular programs, services and diversity initiatives in the Women's College, as well as support to students in the Accelerated/Weekend College and Graduate Studies Program. The position works closely with senior staff, especially the academic vice president, to strengthen student learning and personal growth in an educational program infused with elements of experiential and international learning, service and leadership.

The VPSD oversees a budget of \$1.7 million and supervises 42 full- and part-time staff in residence life, campus activities, orientation, intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and fitness, counseling, community service, disability support services, health and wellness, campus ministry, judicial affairs, leadership programs, the center for career and service learning, diversity, and A Child's Place (an accredited preschool and kindergarten).

The new VPSD will have an unparalleled opportunity to build a vision for an evolving division within the context of a dynamic and innovative learning community. Successful candidates will demonstrate a record of achievement in student affairs, strong management and interpersonal skills and the ability to think strategically. A spirit of collaboration, a genuine commitment to student success and an entrepreneurial approach are desired attributes. An earned doctorate is highly preferred.

Review of applications will begin immediately; candidate materials received by March 24 will be assured full consideration. The new VPSD is expected to assume office in summer 2010.
