The successful candidate will be responsible for the planning, development, administration, supervision and evaluation of the entire academic program on the Fort Wayne, Indiana, campus (www.ivytech.edu/northeast).

Among the challenges and opportunities ahead for the next Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs:

- Helping Ivy Tech-Northeast become the destination of choice for students in the region and effectively managing the campus’s record enrollment growth.
- Devising and implementing strategies to improve student completion rates in both the certificate and degree programs.
- Building on existing relationships with area high schools and increasing high-demand dual-credit programs, including on-campus and online instruction.
- Strengthening partnerships with two- and four-year institutions in the region and state.
- Managing the curriculum to meet emerging workforce trends.
- Leading efforts to develop and implement new degree and certificate programs, expand on-line and hybrid courses, and provide alternative course schedules.
- Working in tandem with the Deans and faculty in all academic divisions on new opportunities for project-based learning.
- Managing, supporting and recruiting full-time and adjunct faculty.
- Increasing access to Ivy Tech Northeast courses through community-based learning sites across the region.
- Assisting Ivy Tech Corporate College in its mission to expand the platform of workforce training programs in partnership with local employers.
- Broadening offerings for Ivy Tech Northeast’s growing international student body through ESL classes, innovative support mechanisms and other strategies.

Qualifications

A doctorate degree is required along with a minimum of five years experience in higher education and a combination of teaching and administrative experience. Prior community college and teaching experience is preferred.

The search committee seeks candidates with a broad base of qualifications that include:

- Budget/grant writing management;
- Higher education accreditation procedures and program review;
- Baccalaureate transfer reporting systems;
- Strong communication skills;
- Demonstrated commitment to technology and innovative methods of instructional delivery.

The review of candidate materials will begin in late December and continue until the position is filled.
